Bronisław Geremek

Bronisław Geremek (1932–2008), scholar, intellectual and politician, a passionate Pole and exemplary European, was a supporter of the IWM almost from its inception and a member of its Board of Patrons until his death. The Bronisław Geremek Fellowship Program commemorates his name and work.

Objective

The Bronisław Geremek Fellowship Program aims to foster the study and reflection of Polish national heritage in the context of European tradition. The fellowship enables Polish junior researchers to work on a research project of their own choice. The fellowship is open to all academic disciplines in the humanities and social sciences; research proposals related to one of the Institute's main research fields are strongly encouraged (for details see www.iwm.at/research).

Conditions

The Bronisław Geremek Fellow will be invited to spend the academic year 2017/18 (ten months from September 2017 to June 2018) at the IWM to pursue her or his research project. Junior Visiting Fellows will receive EUR 1,800 per month to cover accommodation, living expenses, travel, health insurance and incidentals related to their stay in Vienna.

In addition, the IWM provides the fellow with an office including access to internet, in-house research and administrative facilities as well as other services free of charge. The fellow will join the scholarly community and participate in the activities of the Institute.

Eligibility

Candidates for the **Bronisław Geremek Junior Visiting Fellowship**

- must be Polish citizens or permanently reside in Poland
- must currently pursue a doctoral degree or have recently obtained a Ph.D. in any discipline in the humanities or social sciences
- must not be older than 35 years

Application

Applications have to be submitted using the online application form and should include:

- a concise research proposal in English (max. 8,000 characters incl. spaces) outlining
- the academic problem(s) addressed
- a critical consideration of current relevant literature
- the research goals and expected results
- a work and time schedule
- a curriculum vitae
- a list of publications
- two letters of recommendation by scholars familiar with the applicant's academic work (for junior fellows only)

Selection

The finalists will be selected by a jury of experts. Applicants will be notified of the jury's decision in summer 2017. The jury is not required to publicly justify its decisions
